





Snapshot

- □One of **850** community foundations across the nation
- □ Founded in 1994 by 4 Chester County philanthropic families "You don't have to be a Rockefeller to be a legacy philanthropist"
- □ 25 Board Members + 8 FTE Staff + 75 Committee Volunteers
- 425+ entrusted funds
 - 350+ Individual & Family Donor Advised & Scholarship Funds
 - **80+ Nonprofit Endowment Funds**
- □ \$100 million in entrusted assets
- **\$6** million granted annually
- Endowed Funds (up to 5% grant payout)
 Quasi-endowed Funds (up to 20%)
 Provisional Funds (up to 100%)







\$4.99.33 billon

In 2022, Americans gave \$499.33 billion to charity, a 3.4% decline compared to 2021. Adjusted for inflation, total giving declined 10.5%.

HOW DAFs WORK

What is a Donor Advised Fund?















- □ A donor-advised fund, sometimes referred to as a "DAF," is a charitable giving vehicle sponsored by a public charity, like the Chester County Community Foundation. In this role, the Community Foundation is considered a "sponsoring organization" or "DAF sponsor."
- □ Donors contribute to a donor-advised fund at a sponsoring organization, are eligible for a tax deduction, and then recommend grants to IRS-qualified 501(c)(3) public charities.
- Donors can separate the timing of their contributions from their grants, so in the interim, donors choose how their contributions are invested, and the growth is tax-free.

DAFs ORGANIZE AND MAXIMIZE PHILANTHROPY

☐ Select charities through specific fields of interest


ESTATE PLANNING AND GIFTING OPPORTUNITIES

- □ Use existing or create a new DAF in their estate plan
- ☐ Effective Charitable Planning with Advisor
- Discuss Charities with Advisor
- □ Donor Makes Process Easy for Beneficiaries of Estate to Continue Legacy
- □ DAF as the charitable beneficiary under their will, trust, annuity, life insurance contract, retirement plan, or investment account.

Proactive Legacy Planning



Donor Story #1

93 years old, widowed, no children

Needed philanthropy organized

Planned with estate attorney

Created legacy fund for active grantmaking in her lifetime

Legacy/Testamentary Gift Into Fund Upon Death





Donor Story #2

First generation Indian American

Grateful for the opportunities provided arriving in U.S. in 1972

Created legacy fund for active grantmaking in his lifetime but also involving his grandchildren

Family Philanthropy most important to him

Donor Story #3

Retiring attorney

Existing fund included as beneficiary of their IRA upon the passing of spouse

Would like to have the fund transfer balance to sibling's family fund to allow for legacy and family philanthropy

Family Philanthropy most important to him

Donor Story #4 - Gay Street Public School - West Chester, PA

Gay Street Public School – last school in West Chester School District to be desegregated

Alumni of the school created a scholarship fund

Awarded to seniors in West Chester School District

Potential inclusion of Fund in individual estate plans



STEWARDSHIP

PLEASE Focus on the <u>Stewardship of</u> your <u>Donor</u>

According to Schwab Charitable, grantmaking from DAFs to qualified charities totaled more than \$25 billion in 2019, a 93% increase since 2015.

So... How do you attract the attention of donors with DAFs?

- ✓ Identify the donor be a sleuth!
- ✓ Increase your visibility
- ✓ Make it easy for donors to give from their DAFs
- ✓ Share information & insights about effective giving strategies
- ✓ Grow your network of professional advisors

What is Stewardship?
Root word - Old English
stiward, stigweard
"house guardian,
housekeeper"

1. Identify the Donor = Be a Sleuth!

- The **first step** with any donation is to **identify the generous donor**. The same is true of DAF gifts.
- □ Second DAF administrators report that a minority of DAF donors prefer anonymity. It's likely that you will receive some kind of insight into the donor who recommended a gift to your organization. Make sure you code DAF donors separately in your database so they can be stewarded differently.
- □ Third Avoid duplication. DAF donors do not use this giving vehicle exclusively, so it is entirely possible that the donor is already in your database.
- □ Fourth Research. There may be an instance of a "Fund" or "Foundation" being listed as the donor associated with a DAF gift. Make sure to acknowledge their gift and code them correctly in your database for proper stewardship.

2. Communication / Visibility

Communicate with DAF donors directly:

- Equal treatment
- Corresponding with DAF donors
- Acknowledgement letters
- Guidestar by Candid, Charity Navigator, Charity Watch, or Give.org
- Your website
- Share important organizational updates that your DAF donors would like to know

3. Make it Easy for Donors to Give from their DAFs

□ Promote DAF gifts as an option in solicitation materials
Direct Mail Response Devices: BREs, Flap BREs, Tear Offs, giving option sheet
Online: website – place information about giving from DAFs in the
"Donate" or "Ways to Give" area of your website. Make sure you also note
there the ability to leave legacy gifts to your charity (listing as beneficiary)

Donor Advised Funds (DAF)

□ A donor-advised fund is a simple, flexible and tax efficient way to give to your favorite charities, including (NAME OF CHARITY). DAFs also serve as a meaningful way to strengthen your family's tradition of philanthropy.

How to recommend a gift to (NAME OF CHARITY) through DAFs

Contact your Financial Advisor/Donor Advised Fund provider and request a grant distribution

Be sure to use (NAME OF CHARITY)'s EIN # NUMBER

Indicate whether your gift is unrestricted or designated for a specific purpose

You can also designate (NAME OF CHARITY) as a beneficiary for your donor-advised fund

4. Share Insights About Effective Giving Strategies

- Donors who have established DAFs are generally interested in giving effectively & achieving the maximum impact with their philanthropy.
- Include educational information for donors on relevant topics like giving appreciated assets, tax bunching strategies, and others to maximize their giving potential.
- ☐ Share articles with the donor or include in presentations/event remarks

5. IMPORTANT! Grow your Network of Professional Advisors & Philanthropic Advisors

- Treat the philanthropic advisors/professional advisors as VIP door openers to donors
- ☐ Give them information about your organization
- Steward them
- Professional Advisors include: Estate Planning Attorneys, CPAs, Wealth Managers, Financial Advisors
- Philanthropic Advisors include: consultants, Community Foundations, Commercial DAF organizations

6. DAF Donors are Planned Giving Prospects

- About half of DAF donors have a Bequest or legacy giving vehicle Speak with the DAF donor about beneficiary designations

 Your charity can be the beneficiary of their DAF

 Only 25% of DAF grants are pre-scheduled
- OPPORTUNITY FOR YOU If commercial DAF account holders do not specify their legacy options, the organization will consider the account abandoned following a certain period of activity.
- □ Handle differently Steward your DAF donors in a way that invites deeper engagement. Invite in for a tour of your organization. Write hand written notes inviting the donor on your acknowledgement letter.
